To collect new toys, clothes, educational, art and sports items during October to December every year, for distribution to families in need serving babies, children, and youth, 0 – 18 years old, in Lethbridge and surrounding communities.

The Angel Tree Christmas Campaign began 31 years ago in 1992.

Last year, Angel Tree gave gift bundles to 3,571 children.

Christmas Hope:

Angel Tree collaborates with Salvation Army, MyCityCare, Lethbridge Food Bank, and Interfaith Food Bank to coordinate data base efforts and eliminate duplication.
